# Message from Mrs. Lowrey

It is beginning to feel a little festive in school today and what a lovely sight to see all of the children in their Christmas jumpers! With costumes coming in for the performance and carols being rehearsed, it creates a lovely atmosphere in school. It has, however, been a little wet and windy, so please do continue to bring in coats and plenty of layers as it gets colder.

A lot of my focus has been taken up with beginning to think about the move back to school. The works are looking to be completed next week, with the ramp now finished and the internal work complete. However, I will be providing each school with a list of those who have signed up in order that they are released from school. Should your child wish to attend and attends a different secondary school, please do let me know and I will contact their school.

This week, I had the pleasure of speaking to Foxes class who are working on an oracy project with Mrs Bellew. We spoke about our school values and I was delighted to hear them speak about how they value the kindness of our children and adults and how they think it is important to be respectful. They also spoke passionately about our Christian values and how they are looking forward to getting back near to nature. #### **Free school meals**

If you're struggling to pay food bills, we encourage you to <u>check your eligibility and apply for free school meals</u> for your child.

All children in reception, year 1 and year 2 at state schools in England automatically get free school meals. From year 3 onwards, just children whose parents are receiving certain benefits are entitled to free school meals during term time. However, parents are encouraged to apply for free school meals when they enrol their child in school, as this can help their child's school to attract additional '<u>pupil premium</u>' funding to support their learning. Some children whose parents meet the eligibility criteria and whose child attends a school nursery all day can also get a free school meal when they are two, three or four years old.

You can apply for free school meals for your child <u>on our website</u>, and you'll get an instant decision. Or you can call our education helpline on <u>0345 155 1019</u>.

If you have applied unsuccessfully before and your financial circumstances have since changed, please apply again.

#### Supermarket vouchers for the school holidays

The financial challenges faced by some families can be intensified during school holidays because of increased costs such as food, especially with the current cost of living, and reduced incomes due to childcare.

We want to make sure that no child in Devon goes hungry in the school holidays, when free school meals are unavailable. We can only do that by using some of the Government's Household Support Fund to help families who receive benefits-related free school meals during term time, to purchase food over the holidays.

Supermarket vouchers worth £45 will be sent to each child currently eligible for free school meals during term time, to spend during the Christmas holiday and February half-term break to replace the meals they would have had at school during the day. More detailed information about our free school meals holiday voucher scheme is <u>available on our website</u>.

#### Free school holiday activities

Children aged five to 16-years-old who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals are invited to take part in our action-packed <u>Holiday Activities and Food programme.</u>

We've teamed up with over 60 different providers across Devon to offer a great range of free physical activities and healthy, nutritional, hot meals during the school holidays.

Activities including a range of sports and coaching opportunities, indoor and outdoor play activities; magic and circus skills; film making; arts and crafts; music; cooking; theatre workshops; yoga and mindfulness; and a lot more! Some schemes are also offering hampers for the holidays.

Bookings are now open, and details of activities can be <u>found on our interactive map</u>. If your child is <u>eligible to</u> <u>access the programme</u>, simply search for a provider in your area, have a look at their listing to see what they're offering, then when you're ready, book a place with them directly.

#### Free School Meals

#### Check if your child can get free school meals and additional funding support.

All children in reception, year 1 and year 2 at state schools in England automatically get free school meals. However, parents and guardians are encouraged to apply for free school meals when they enrol their child in school, as this can help their child's school to attract additional '<u>pupil premium</u>' funding to support learning. From year 3 onwards, children whose parents are getting any of the following are entitled to free school meals:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).
- Income Support (IS).
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA).
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA).
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income that does not exceed £16,190).
- Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment you get for a further 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).

#### How to apply

Apply through the <u>Devon Citizens Portal</u>. This is the quickest and easiest way to apply and will result in you getting an instant decision. Alternatively, call the Education Helpline on 0345 155 1019.
